## MANDATE

*The Mandate of the Kenya Professionals Development Fund (KPDF) is to promote the development of professionals and professionalism in Kenya and the East Africa region.*

## FUNCTIONS OF THE FUND

According to the current **KPDF Trust Deed**, the objectives of the Fund are:

- a) To promote the growth and development of professional education and training;
- b) To promote, encourage or otherwise support the adoption and application of best industry practices in professional conduct, standards and ethics;
- c) To support and provide funds for strengthening professional values, ethics and integrity among professionals;
- d) To support the strengthening of professional disciplinary mechanisms and their enforcement;
- e) To support and undertake training and capacity building activities for professionals and professional institutions as may be found appropriate from time to time;
- f) To sponsor any activities, studies, undertakings, promotions and implementation of professional-related programmes, which help any or all of the above activities;
- g) To raise funds and other resources from all acceptable sources and means to set up the Fund as an endowment Fund to secure the cause and sustainability of the Fund.

## FUND MEMBERSHIP

The members of KPDF are drawn from the APSEA membership, its Founder, which is the apex umbrella body (Association) that brings together professional bodies of diverse disciplines. Its members are body corporate associations that have been registered in Kenya whose members are recognized professionals in their areas of training and practice, having been duly licensed and regulated by a competent regulatory authority. Accordingly, the Fund's beneficiaries shall be drawn from **APSEA** Corporate members.

## KENYA REVENUE AUTHORITY INTRODUCES THE 9TH CORPORATE PLAN (2024/25-2028/2029)

KRA has launched the 9th Corporate Plan (2024/2025-2028/2029), as its new five-year planning cycle developed through an extensive participatory process involving staff, management, the Board, and external stakeholders. This shift aligns with national development blueprints like Vision 2030's Medium-Term Plans and the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA).

It sets out strategic direction for assessing, collecting, accounting for all revenues, and advising on tax administration.

The Plan outlines the strategic direction for the Authority to deliver on its mandate of assessing, collecting and accounting for all revenues, and advising on matters relating to the administration of taxes. Over the five-year plan period, the Authority will focus on attaining four strategic goals within the seven identified KRAs; the KRAs are: (1) revenue mobilisation, (2) customs border management, (3) tax simplification, (4) taxpayer education and , (5) trade facilitation, (6) operational efficiency, and (7) human resource management.

Annual targets for both outcome and output indicators have been set and indicative budgets proposed for the key activities to be implemented over the Plan period. A robust monitoring, evaluation and reporting framework is in place to track performance.

The Authority reaffirms its commitment and remains true to its mission of efficiently and effectively mobilizing government revenue and facilitating trade by fostering compliance with tax and customs laws.
